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Long Beach Transit Gears up for Service Change and Popular Museum Express Program

LONG BEACH, CALIF. (May 24, 2013) – Long Beach Transit announces its regular summer service change and start of its museum program which takes customers to many museums in Los Angeles and Orange County during the summer months.

Museum Express: One of Long Beach Transit's most popular programs, Museum Express gives residents the opportunity to travel to well-known, often nationally-acclaimed, museums and gardens for only \$8 via a comfortable, air conditioned Long Beach Transit bus. Destinations include the Getty Center, Griffith Park Observatory, The Huntington and many others. New to the schedule this year are the Pasadena Museum of California Art, Pacific Asia Museum and the USS Iowa B-61. The program operates June 20 through August 18, 2013. Over-the-counter sales begin June 5 at the downtown Transit and Visitor Information Center on the southeast corner of 1st and Pine.

Service Change (Effective June 2, 2013): To coincide with the summer season, a few minor Long Beach Transit service changes will be made:

- **Passport Service:** Weekend service during peak hours will increase to every 8 minutes. Minor schedule adjustments for weekend night service.
- **Route 51 & 61:** Minor weekday schedule changes.
- **Route 96 ZAP:** Route will operate Monday through Friday except for certain holidays until June 13. Thereafter, service will not operate again until the fall service change.
- **Routes 91, 92, 93, 94, 111, 112, 121, 151 and 171:** These routes will all have a slight reduction in service due to lower ridership during the summer months.
 - **Routes 91, 92, 93 and 94** combined weekday service will run every 12 minutes.
 - **Route 111 and 112** combined weekday service will run every 20 minutes during peak hours.
 - **Route 121:** Service will run every 20 minutes all day on weekdays.
 - **Route 151:** Weekend service will run every 35 minutes.
 - **Route 171:** Weekday service will run 30-35 minutes all along the route.
- **Route 102:** The westbound schedule for one midday trip has been adjusted.
- **Routes 172, 173 and 174:** Minor weekend schedule changes.
