Long Beach Transit Detour Information for Long Beach Marathon
Long Beach Transit Encourages the Community to Use Public Transportation on Race Day

LONG BEACH, CALIF. (October 10, 2014) – On Sunday, October 12, some Long Beach Transit routes will be on detour due to the Long Beach International City Bank Marathon. Customers should expect detours and some delays until 5 p.m. or until street closures are reopened.

To minimize traffic delays and parking congestion, Long Beach Transit encourages race-goers and the community to leave their cars at home and instead use public transportation on race day. LBT bus operators and supervisors work closely with city officials in order to efficiently navigate around road closures to get customers to their desired destinations.

LBT detour information is as follows:

Passport: There will be no service south of Ocean Boulevard. The route will detour along Ocean, and will continue its current route along Pacific Avenue, to and from 10th Street.

Routes 91 & 94: There will be no service from these routes within California State University, Long Beach. The routes will also detour on other segments that are affected by the Marathon.

Routes 21, 22, 45, 46, 91, 94, 121, 131, 151, 171, 173: Due to Marathon road closures, these routes will have segmented detours.

The center will be open on race day 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.
