Long Beach Transit to Return to Transit Hub on 1st Street *LA Metro Completes Blue Line Rail Work in the LBT Transit Gallery*

LONG BEACH, CALIF. (October 17, 2014) – On Monday, October 20, 2014, Long Beach Transit’s Transit Gallery, on 1st Street between Long Beach Boulevard and Pine Avenue, will reopen to buses and customers. The transit hub was temporarily relocated while Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) upgraded and modernized the Blue Line rail system. By the end of the day on Sunday, October 19, the rail work on the Transit Gallery will be completed.

Customers will connect with LBT routes at the same shelters they did previously at the Transit Gallery.
